Traffickers target people they do not know.

Many survivors are trafficked by romantic partners, spouses, acquaintances, and family members including parents.

# myth fact

All commercial sex is human trafficking.

All commercial sex involving a minor is legally considered human trafficking. Commercial sex involving an adult is human trafficking if the person providing commercial sex is doing so against his or her will as a result of force, fraud, or coercion.

# myth fact

Human Trafficking involves moving, traveling, or transporting a person across state or national borders.

The crime of human trafficking does not require any movement whatsoever. Survivors can be recruited and trafficked in their own hometowns, even their own homes.

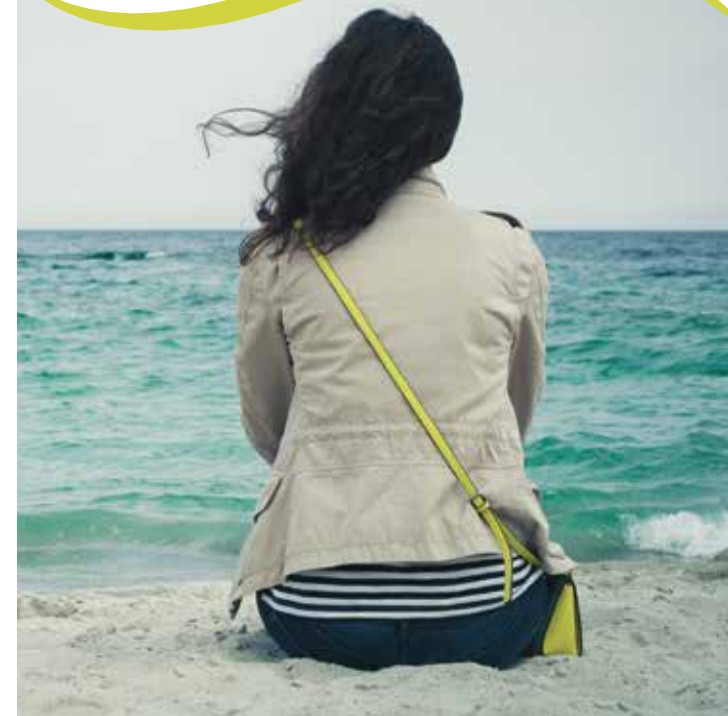

## HUMAN TRAFFICKING

involves the use of **force, fraud, or coercion** in exchange for labor, services, or a commercial sex act.

There are between **20-40 million** people in modern day slavery.

In 2019, **157** Indiana Human Trafficking cases were reported to the National Human Trafficking Hotline.



## ADVOCATING FROM HOUR ONE

Our **Advocates** respond 24/7 to medical and judicial facilities in Lake, Porter, and LaPorte Counties. They are professionally trained to support survivors and help them navigate the complex waters of “what now?”

Advocates provide the continuum of care and:

- Support survivors emotionally and discuss coping strategies
- Explain and accompany during medical process
- Address immediate needs and make a safety plan
- Give information on legal rights and criminal justice proceedings
- Assist with victim compensation paperwork
- Educate family and friends on how to support a loved one affected by trauma
- Provide confidentiality. Communication is privileged
- Stay with survivors through the entire journey

## KNOWING THE WARNING SIGNS

Some of the high risk indicators for being trafficked **include:**

- Recent relocation/migration
- Substance use
- Runaway/homeless youth
- Mental health concerns
- Involvement in the child welfare system
- Previous victimization and vulnerability
- Family history of abuse, neglect, or substance use
- Personal or family history of untreated mental health issues
- Isolated/marginalized populations
